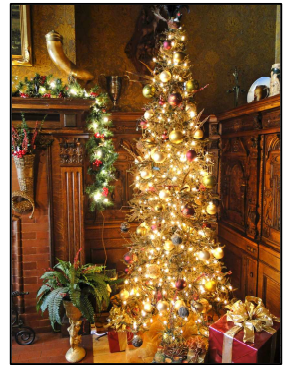


A GRAND AVENUE CHRISTMAS

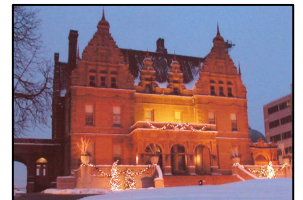
