Come see with your very eyes the development of Spring Street into Grand Avenue, where such prominent families as the Plankintons', Schandeins', Franks', and of course the Pabsts', built grand mansions along one of the city's main thoroughfares. What is the story of this street, its inhabitants, its development, and most importantly what happened to the grand mansions of the 1870s, 80s, and 90s. Find out this summer as the Captian Frederick Pabst Mansion proudly presents the very popular ***Gone But Not Forgotten: Revisited.***

Back by popular demand, *Gone But Not Forgotten: Revisited* draws upon the success of the original 2002 exhibit of the same name. Again presented in conjunction with the Milwaukee County Historical Society, *Revisited* will indeed do just that, revisit the old mansions that once stood.
