

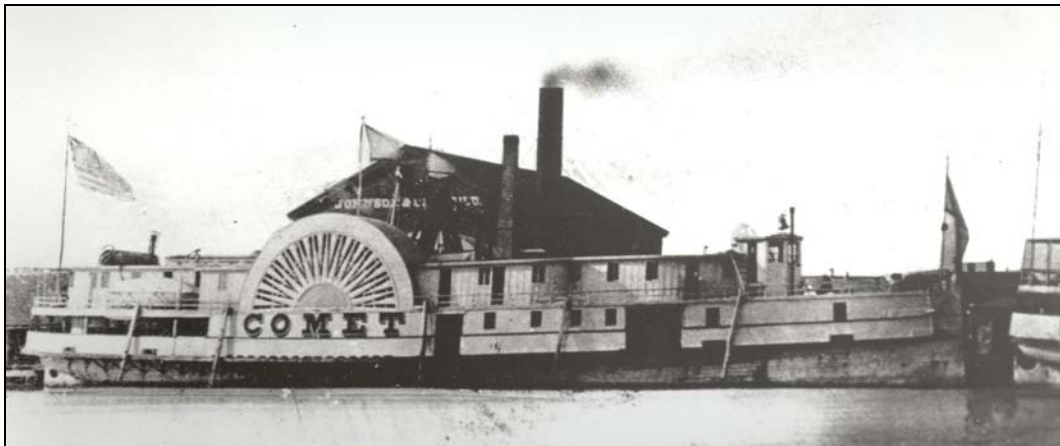

The Life of Captain Frederick Pabst
January 21-June 5, 2011



The story of Captain Frederick Pabst embodies all of the elements of the 19th century American dream; the thought that with hard work and determination, anyone could rise to the top of industry and society. His story is the very definition of “Gilded Age”.

Frederick Pabst would turn that small brewery into the largest lager brewery in the world by 1890, affording him and his family wealth they had never known before. The 1890s would become known as the “Pabst Decade” in Milwaukee, and Frederick Pabst would pass away on January 1, 1904, recognized as one of the world’s leading brewers, a much loved philanthropist, and true patron of the arts. But what happened in between the takeover of the Best Brewing Company and his death? A lot of things actually...

In celebration of Frederick Pabst’s 175th birthday on March 28, 2011, the Pabst Mansion will examine the life of Milwaukee’s foremost 19th century citizen with photographs, documents, and first person accounts of a German immigrant who rose to become one of the most well known personalities in Wisconsin history.

The Pabst Mansion is open Monday-Saturday 10:00am-4:00pm and Sunday noon-4:00pm (Closed Monday mid-January through February).
